# I-HoP provides programs in English for supporting the career development of young international researchers at Hokkaido University





#### Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development

The FOHRED helps to diversify the career paths of doctoral course students and postdoctoral researchers, hires and develops tenure-track teaching staff as next-generation leaders and provides support and a better academic environment for female teaching staff and students who wish to become researchers.



# About I-HoP

The International Human Resource Development Program (I-HoP) of the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development provides various programs in English in order to support the career development of young foreign researchers (doctoral candidates and postdocs: henceforth DCs and PDs) at Hokkaido University. The programs are broadly divided as 'seminar for improving transferable research ability', 'individual career counseling', 'support for learning Japanese language', and 'fact-finding survey on international students'.

In the academic year 2019, besides long-standing activities, the 'English-speaking' matching event 'for DCs and PDs' called 'CAREER LINK MEETUP' (the English version of Akaiito-Kai) was held for the first time. This was a spin-off of the information exchange meeting named 'Akaiito-Kai' between companies and DCs and PDs which the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development had organized for supporting DCs and PDs. English-speaking matching events with domestic companies have rarely been held in Japan, and this was an extremely important initiative.

In career-interest surveys of foreign DCs and PDs conducted every year by the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development, more than 40% of them every time answered that they would like to stay in Japan. Proficiency in Japanese is often required when they apply for a job in Japan. I-HoP is collecting information about companies which do not require applicants to have proficiency in Japanese, in order to help excellent foreign DCs and PDs remain in Japan.



This is the English-speaking information exchange meeting between DCs, PDs and companies. This was held entirely in English with the same structure as that of 'Akaiito-Kai' in Japanese, which had been organized by the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development for helping DCs and PDs. Each company gave a short presentation about what types of DCs and PDs would be needed, and DCs and PDs gave poster presentations about their research and skills. After that, there was a booth visit session in which DCs and PDs could visit any companies' booths. Then they moved to a cafeteria in the Department of Engineering for exchanging information and socializing. It was a half-day event full of 'nice long talk that could be made only here'.

HoP of the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development held the English-speaking information exchange meeting 'CAREER LINK MEETUP -For international DCs and PDs-' between foreign researchers (DCs and PDs) and domestic companies in the Frontier Research in Applied Sciences Building on Tuesday 10 December for the first time.

On the day of the event, 19 people from seven domestic companies including Sony Corporation, and 24 DCs and PDs, including those who came from partner universities (six persons from Okinawa Institute of Science and Technology Graduate University and one person from University of Hyogo) of 'Comprehensive Cooperative System for Fostering Researchers with Doctoral Degrees', participated.

After the opening address by Hisanori Bando, associate director of the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development, there were short presentations by companies, poster presentations about research and skills by DCs and PDs, the company booth session, and the information exchange session. Everything was done in English, and everyone could interact closely with each other.

After the event, the DCs and PDs who participated gave positive comments like "it was very good that the event was held in English", "I deepened my knowledge about Japanese companies", and "the event was far more fruitful than expected". Some participants found the possibility of future internships. In addition, several participating companies commented that the event should be held regularly in the future.

Exchange meetings between DCs, PDs and companies are held at many universities in Japan, including 'Akaiito-Kai' of our university which has existed for 14 years, and most of them are open to foreigners. However, participants in all of the meetings are supposed to communicate in Japanese, and those who are not very good at speaking Japanese have very little chance of interacting with recruiters of Japanese companies and getting a job.

Based on the 'Hokkaido Universal Campus Initiative' scheme, Hokkaido University is promoting internationalization in the campus like the expansion of international graduate schools, with the aim of becoming 'Hokkaido University's contributions to solving world issues'. Many foreign DCs and PDs are working hard every day in Hokkaido University. In career-interest surveys of foreign DCs and PDs conducted every year by the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development, more than 40% of them every time answered that they would like to stay in Japan. I-HoP considered that providing foreign DCs/PDs and 'Japanese companies which do not require applicants to have proficiency in Japanese at the time of application' with opportunities for exchange in English must be beneficial and extremely important for both parties. This is why I-HoP organized this event.

I-HoP has improved the career building support platform, which had been designed mainly for Japanese DCs and PDs and systematically built up, in order to expand the functions of the global support system for foreign DCs and PDs. In addition, I-HoP has made efforts to help foreign DCs and PDs broaden their career options in Japan, through supporting their Japanese language lessons and creating opportunities of meeting between them and Japanese companies. Several companies could not participate in this event because of scheduling conflicts, and other partner universities are interested in this event. It is expected that the event would be held regularly in the future, and that it would eventually contribute to raising those foreigners' employment rate in Japan.

-HoP organized a group visit to overseas companies called 'USA Site Visit in RTP' from Sunday 1 December to Saturday 7 December. A group of DCs visited four companies and three universities in Research Triangle Park (RTP) in North Carolina, USA. The visit was originally scheduled in October, but it was unfortunately postponed because of the arrival of Typhoon Hagibis. So it was a long-awaited trip to the USA for the participants.

During the trip to the USA, four DCs visited four companies (Red Hat, BASF, IBM and Syngenta), and three universities (North Carolina State University, Duke University, and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill), with the cooperation of Technology Partnership of Nagoya University, Inc. (NU Tech), that is the USA technology transfer office of Nagoya University, one of the partner universities of 'Comprehensive Cooperative System for Fostering Researchers with Doctoral Degrees'. After hearing explanations about the business and workplace from the person in charge at each company, they visited facilities, and presented their research in English, and discussed doctors' career with researchers of the companies. On the final day, there was a review meeting at NU Tech, and all participants talked about what they learned from this trip and how they would like to make the most of what they learned after returning to Japan. Each participant stated his determination like "I want to bring what I got from this program back to the Japanese community", and "my goal of getting a job at a company has become clear. I will further improve my skills toward that goal".

I-HoP has organized overseas site visits since 2018 in order to broaden the career options of Japanese and foreign DCs and PDs. Nowadays it is easy to get information instantly from abroad via the internet, but it is important to actually experience the research/work environment in the USA. Participants commented, "I got an image for my future move to the USA", "I felt the difference between Japan and the USA in my bones", "what I have to do in the future has become clear", and "I was only thinking about pursuing my career in academia after earning a doctoral degree, but my horizons were broadened". It is obvious that they got strong inspirations for future research and campus life. It is expected that they would be more active in the future.

#### Participant's comments

Before visiting RTP, I was wondering which I should go to a company or academia after getting my Ph.D. Thorough all visit, it was a good opportunity to think about my future career after my Ph.D.

I also learned about research differences between companies and academia. This made me want to do research in the company. In all the companies I visited, I heard the opinion that what is important in finding a job is not what your major is, but how you can adjust your experience to corporate projects. What I learned through RTP is to clarify what I want to do.

Hokkaido University has set the aim of "enhancing career support for international researchers" in its medium-term plan in order to achieve the goal of globalization in the third medium-term goals. As one of its activities, I-HoP continues to provide opportunities of individual career consultations for international researchers.

International researchers have a wide range of career options, like "finding a position in a private company or academia" and "remaining in Japan, returning home, or looking for a position in other country", and have to dwell on them.

In addition, even if one would like to get a job in

Japan, one finds it very difficult to understand the employment system and job hunting schedule which are unique to Japan. Moreover, one needs to consider the field and kind of job for obtaining a residence permit.

In order to support international researchers' career selection in such complicated situations, I-HoP provides careful and timely consultation opportunities. First, an interview is conducted mainly in English for understanding each researcher's situation, wishes, and options. Then, suggestions and advice on how to take appropriate action are provided.
