About I-HoP

What is the International Human Resource Development Program?

The International Human Resource Development Program (I-HoP) of the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development (FOHRED) provides various programs in English to support the career development of young international researchers (DCs and PDs) at Hokkaido University. It organizes "seminars to improve transferable skills", "individual career counseling", "support for learning Japanese", and "surveys on international students".

It also holds the CAREER LINK MEETUP, which is an extremely rare event in Japan for DCs and PDs who want to get in touch with companies in English.

For many years, the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development has held the information exchange meeting in Japanese named "Akai Ito Kai" for letting DCs and PDs meet companies. Since the academic year 2019, I-HoP has held this meeting entirely in English, and several participants have received job offers.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, all seminars and events were held online in the academic year 2020. Visits to overseas companies, which had been made since the academic year 2018, were also canceled. However, as many international students would like to build their careers in countries other than Japan in the future, we hold online lectures by researchers who are active abroad, and continue to help the students diversify their career paths.

In addition, we realize that it is difficult to grasp the needs of all international students just by counseling the students who contact

I-HoP directly. We have therefore begun to interview the supervisors of international students to observe the actual situation of international students from various angles.

There are various restrictions in the unprecedented pandemic situation, but we will do our best at any time and continue to provide support so that each student can make a reasonable choice.

-HoP of the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development held an information exchange meeting in English called "CAREER LINK MEETUP 2020 -For international DCs and PDs-" for international DCs/PDs and domestic companies on Wednesday 28 October. In order to prevent the spread of the new coronavirus, this year's meeting was held online.

Nine domestic companies including Shiseido Company, Limited as well as 28 DCs/PDs including those from partner universities through the "Career Development Project for Researchers of Allied Universities" (one from Niigata University, two from Yokohama National University, one from Hyogo Prefectural University, and two from Okinawa Institute of Science and Technology Graduate University) participated in the event.

The day began with a welcome address by Makoto Demura, Deputy Director of the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development. After a short talk by each company, participants moved to breakout rooms. DCs and PDs gave presentations on their research and skills, and companies held booth sessions. All was done in English,

and they could communicate deeply with each other.

DCs and PDs who participated in the event said, "it was useful for us to know about various Japanese companies and what kind of human resources they looked for" and "it was very good for us to have a job hunting experience and to think about our future career". The companies commented, "we want to have more events like this in the future".

International students make up approximately one-third of all doctoral course students at this university, and career support for them is an urgent issue. I-HoP has developed the career development support platform established by the Front Office for Human Resource Education and Development mainly for Japanese DCs and PDs into a global support system that takes international DCs and PDs into consideration, and is now making various efforts to broaden their career paths in Japan. The creation of opportunities for exchange with domestic companies in English has attracted particular attention from companies and partner universities. They expect that this event should continue in the future as it will contribute to improving the employment rate of international students in Japan.

-HoP invited researchers who were active in the United States and organized an online lecture series for international and Japanese students who sought careers abroad.

On 4 September, Dr. Tomoko Chubachi (Chief Mentor of the Institute of Drug Development Career Promotion and Chief Medical Officer of Novan) gave a lecture entitled "Drug Development in the Pharmaceutical Industry". On 6 November, Dr. Jean-Philippe Therrien (Principal and Owner of JP Therrien Consulting LLC) gave a lecture entitled "Research opportunities outside academic institutions". On 20 January, Dr. Mariko F. Matsuura (Researcher at the Research and Development Department of Corteva Agriscience) gave a lecture entitled "Careers in the United States: How to find a place where you can shine". All lectures were live-streamed from the speakers' locations via Zoom.

In each seminar, the speaker spoke from there about practical things in the United States, including drug

development and career paths in the pharmaceutical industry, possible options as non-academic researchers, career options after completing the doctoral program, and how to work in the United States. The lecture was followed by a guestion-and-answer session.

It is difficult for most of us to travel abroad in the midst of the pandemic, but the participants could see that researchers were working in the world every day in various ways and consider pursuing careers abroad more seriously.

In the academic years 2018 and 2019, "overseas site visits" were organized. Participants visited companies in the United States and gave presentations on site. Unfortunately, this event could not be held in the academic year 2020, but all of the seminars held in this academic year became possible precisely because they were held online. I-HoP will continue to explore what can be done even in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, and to support students who pursue their careers abroad in many ways.

Visits to overseas sites have been made in the academic years 2018 and 2019 but became impossible in the academic year 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic. I-HoP decided to organize lectures by researchers who were active abroad, in order to continue to support students who would like to pursue their careers abroad even in the midst of the pandemic. Three seminars live-streamed from the United States could be held. Whereas only a limited number of people could participate in the visits to overseas sites, more students could participate in the online seminars and ask questions directly to researchers in the United States. This new form of seminar proved to be a great success.

The landscape of drug development in the pharmaceutical industry changes in a short timeframe. Once the seeds show promising potential in the venture company or startup companies, these seeds will be bought by large pharmaceutical companies which have abundant resources to run clinical trials. Running clinical trials is extremely expensive and the average cost exceeds billion dollars. Therefore, any pharmaceutical companies make efforts to minimize the cost, maximize efficiencies toward early approval of the drug. Many animal studies and pharmacology studies are often outsourced to the contract research organizations (CROs) and academic institutions. Depending on the expertise, the career path crosses between the sponsor and CROs. It is important for your career planning to understand the structure and functions of the matrix team of the pharmaceutical companies and identify where your strength contributes most.

Hokkaido University has set the aim of "enhancing career support for international researchers" in its medium-term plan in order to achieve the goal of globalization in the third medium-term goals. As one of its activities, I-HoP continues to provide opportunities of individual career consultations for international researchers.

International researchers have a wide range of career options, like "finding a position in a private company or academia" and "remaining in Japan, returning home, or looking for a position in other country", and have to dwell on them.

In addition, even if one would like to get a job in

Japan, one finds it very difficult to understand the employment system and job hunting schedule which are unique to Japan. Moreover, one needs to consider the field and kind of job for obtaining a residence permit.

In order to support international researchers' career selection in such complicated situations, I-HoP provides careful and timely consultation opportunities. First, an interview is conducted mainly in English for understanding each researcher's situation, wishes, and options. Then, suggestions and advice on how to take appropriate action are provided.
